WEEKLY VISITATION/COMMUNION: Homebound parishioners are encouraged to receive communion regularly.



Ignatius himself was constantly attuned to his own inner promptings. This self-knowledge -- open to the movements of the Holy Spirit -- led him to be an incredibly astute spiritual director. For Ignatius, recognizing God as the first principle of one's life determined everything. How has God changed you?

From The Deacon's Desk:

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Wow! Absolutely amazing! As all of you know, Liz and I attended the 10th Eucharistic Congress. It has been 83 years since the last Eucharistic Congress, which was held in St. Minneapolis in 1941. It was incredible. Pilgrims came from all 50 states and 17 countries. There were over 200 bishops and cardinals, 1500 priests, 400 deacons, 700 seminarians, and over 50,000 faithful.

We added your prayers every day at Mass. The speakers were both motivating and challenging. All of the speakers were the most well-known Catholic theologians, entertainers and influencers in the world. They included Johnathan Roumie, Fr. Micheal Schmits, Jeff Kavin & the list goes on. But it was a little nun's, Sister Joesephine Garret's, talk that was the most impactful for me.

She asked the question: "Where does God rank in your priorities?" If your answer is number 1,2,3, then the question is does your life reflect your answer. If we say, God is a top priority in our lives, then how much time do we spend in uninterrupted intentional prayer? Five minutes? 10 minutes? 15 minutes? Would our spouse or our best friend feel like they were a top priority if we only spent five or 10 minutes a day with them? I felt like she was poking me in the chest when she directly asked "how much time do you spend in prayer?" Look at your calendar or reflect on an average day. Do you spend more time on other things, than you do with God?

If you are like me, and feel very uncomfortable by your answer, I would ask you to commit, as I have, to do daily prayer. Whatever amount of time you spent in prayer, consider doubling it. If you don't do any uninterrupted, intentional, prayer with God, then I challenge you to take 15 minutes of quiet time talking and listening to your Father. I hope you will commit to this. We cannot say that God is the most important thing in our life but spend no time talking and listening to Him. Actions speak louder than words.
